THE PRODUCTION OF ICONS FOLLOWED STRICT ARTISTIC CONVENTIONS DESIGNED TO TRANSCEND EARTHLY REALISM AND CONVEY SPIRITUAL TRUTHS. FIGURES TEND TO BE FRONTAL, SOLEMN, AND HIERATIC, WITH LARGE, EXPRESSIVE EYES MEANT TO ENGAGE THE VIEWER'S SOUL RATHER THAN THEIR SENSES.

MOSAICS AND FRESCOS: THE GLITTERING HEART OF BYZANTINE ART

MOSAICS ARE AMONG THE MOST CELEBRATED FORMS OF BYZANTINE ART. THESE WORKS, COMPOSED OF TINY PIECES OF COLORED GLASS, STONE, OR GOLD LEAF, ADORNED THE WALLS AND CEILINGS OF CHURCHES, CREATING SHIMMERING SURFACES THAT SEEMED TO CAPTURE AND RADIATE DIVINE LIGHT. FRESCOS, PAINTED DIRECTLY ONTO PLASTER WALLS, COMPLEMENTED MOSAICS BY DEPICTING BIBLICAL NARRATIVES AND SAINTS' LIVES IN A MORE ACCESSIBLE MEDIUM. BOTH MOSAICS AND FRESCOS USED VIBRANT COLORS AND GOLD BACKGROUNDS TO SYMBOLIZE THE HEAVENLY REALM.

ARCHITECTURAL MARVELS AS ARTISTIC EXPRESSIONS

- **IVORY CARVING:** IVORY WAS A PRIZED MATERIAL FOR SMALL DEVOTIONAL OBJECTS, SUCH AS DIPTYCHS AND RELIQUARIES, SHOWCASING DELICATE AND PRECISE RELIEF WORK.
- **METALWORK AND ENAMEL:** BYZANTINE ARTISANS EXCELLED IN CRAFTING ORNATE CROSSES, CHALICES, AND JEWELRY USING GOLD, SILVER, AND CLOISONNÉ ENAMEL TECHNIQUES.
