How Long Is A Tour of Duty? Understanding Military Service Periods

HOW LONG IS A TOUR OF DUTY IS A QUESTION OFTEN ASKED BY THOSE CURIOUS ABOUT MILITARY SERVICE TIMELINES, WHETHER BY PROSPECTIVE SERVICE MEMBERS, THEIR FAMILIES, OR CIVILIANS INTERESTED IN MILITARY OPERATIONS. THE PHRASE “TOUR OF DUTY” GENERALLY REFERS TO THE LENGTH OF TIME A SERVICE MEMBER SPENDS DEPLOYED OR ASSIGNED TO A PARTICULAR DUTY STATION, OFTEN IN A COMBAT ZONE OR OVERSEAS LOCATION. HOWEVER, THE EXACT DURATION CAN VARY WIDELY DEPENDING ON THE BRANCH OF SERVICE, THE NATURE OF THE ASSIGNMENT, THE COUNTRY’S MILITARY POLICIES, AND THE SPECIFIC MISSION OBJECTIVES. IN THIS ARTICLE, WE’LL EXPLORE THE NUANCES BEHIND WHAT CONSTITUTES A TOUR OF DUTY, FACTORS INFLUENCING ITS LENGTH, AND WHAT SERVICE MEMBERS TYPICALLY EXPERIENCE DURING THIS PERIOD.

DEFINING A TOUR OF DUTY

BEFORE DIVING INTO HOW LONG A TOUR OF DUTY USUALLY LASTS, IT’S IMPORTANT TO CLARIFY WHAT THE TERM MEANS. A TOUR OF DUTY IS ESSENTIALLY A FIXED PERIOD DURING WHICH MILITARY PERSONNEL ARE DEPLOYED OR STATIONED AT A SPECIFIC LOCATION, OFTEN AWAY FROM THEIR HOME BASE. THIS CAN INCLUDE COMBAT DEPLOYMENTS, PEACEKEEPING MISSIONS, OR EVEN ASSIGNMENTS IN SUPPORT ROLES ABROAD.

THE DURATION OF A TOUR CAN DIFFER SIGNIFICANTLY BETWEEN DIFFERENT BRANCHES OF THE MILITARY—ARMY, NAVY, AIR FORCE, MARINES—AND EVEN BETWEEN COUNTRIES. FOR EXAMPLE, A TOUR IN THE U.S. ARMY MIGHT DIFFER IN LENGTH FROM ONE IN THE U.K. ROYAL NAVY OR THE AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE FORCE.

TYPICAL LENGTHS OF TOURS

MOST TOURS OF DUTY RANGE ANYWHERE FROM 6 MONTHS TO 12 MONTHS, BUT THERE ARE NUMEROUS EXCEPTIONS DEPENDING ON THE MISSION AND OPERATIONAL NEEDS.

- ****ARMY TOURS:**** OFTEN LAST BETWEEN 9 TO 12 MONTHS, ESPECIALLY FOR COMBAT DEPLOYMENTS IN PLACES LIKE AFGHANISTAN OR IRAQ. HOWEVER, SOME ASSIGNMENTS CAN BE SHORTER, AROUND 6 MONTHS.
- ****NAVY DEPLOYMENTS:**** MAY HAVE LONGER OR MORE VARIABLE DURATIONS, SOMETIMES STRETCHING TO 6 MONTHS OR MORE AT SEA.
- ****AIR FORCE TOURS:**** CAN BE SHORTER OR LONGER DEPENDING ON THE BASE AND MISSION BUT TEND TO BE CLOSER TO 6 MONTHS.
- ****MARINES:**** USUALLY HAVE 7-MONTH COMBAT TOURS, THOUGH THIS CAN VARY.

THESE TIMELINES ARE INFLUENCED BY A VARIETY OF FACTORS INCLUDING OPERATIONAL TEMPO, TROOP ROTATION POLICIES, AND STRATEGIC REQUIREMENTS.

FACTORS THAT INFLUENCE TOUR LENGTH

UNDERSTANDING WHY TOUR LENGTHS VARY REQUIRES LOOKING AT THE BIGGER PICTURE OF MILITARY STRATEGY AND PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT. SEVERAL KEY FACTORS COME INTO PLAY:

MILITARY BRANCH AND ROLE

DIFFERENT BRANCHES HAVE DISTINCT OPERATIONAL PATTERNS. FOR INSTANCE, THE NAVY OFTEN REQUIRES EXTENDED SEA DEPLOYMENTS, WHICH CAN BE TAXING BUT ARE DIFFERENT IN NATURE FROM THE INTENSE GROUND COMBAT TOURS EXPERIENCED BY THE ARMY OR MARINES. SIMILARLY, SUPPORT PERSONNEL SUCH AS MEDICAL TEAMS OR LOGISTICS UNITS MIGHT HAVE DIFFERENT

TOUR LENGTHS COMPARED TO FRONTLINE COMBAT TROOPS.

GEOPOLITICAL CONTEXT AND MISSION TYPE

THE NATURE OF THE CONFLICT OR MISSION HEAVILY INFLUENCES THE LENGTH OF A TOUR. PEACEKEEPING MISSIONS UNDER THE UNITED NATIONS MAY HAVE LONGER OR MORE FLEXIBLE TOURS COMPARED TO HIGH-INTENSITY COMBAT OPERATIONS. LIKEWISE, MISSIONS IN STABLE REGIONS MIGHT RESULT IN SHORTER OR ROTATIONAL ASSIGNMENTS.

MILITARY POLICIES AND ROTATION SYSTEMS

MOST MODERN MILITARIES HAVE POLICIES DESIGNED TO BALANCE OPERATIONAL EFFECTIVENESS WITH TROOP WELFARE. ROTATION SYSTEMS ARE ESTABLISHED TO ENSURE SOLDIERS AREN'T OVEREXPOSED TO COMBAT STRESS AND TO MAINTAIN MORALE. FOR EXAMPLE, THE U.S. MILITARY HAS IMPLEMENTED POLICIES THAT TYPICALLY LIMIT COMBAT TOURS TO AROUND 12 MONTHS, WITH MANDATORY REST AND RECUPERATION PERIODS BETWEEN DEPLOYMENTS.

PERSONAL CIRCUMSTANCES AND VOLUNTEERING

IN SOME CASES, SERVICE MEMBERS MAY VOLUNTEER FOR EXTENDED TOURS OR SPECIFIC ASSIGNMENTS, LEADING TO VARIATIONS IN TOUR LENGTH. MEDICAL CONDITIONS, FAMILY SITUATIONS, OR OTHER PERSONAL FACTORS CAN ALSO INFLUENCE DEPLOYMENT DURATIONS.

WHAT HAPPENS DURING A TOUR OF DUTY?

KNOWING HOW LONG A TOUR OF DUTY LASTS IS JUST ONE PIECE OF THE PUZZLE. EQUALLY IMPORTANT IS UNDERSTANDING WHAT SERVICE MEMBERS EXPERIENCE DURING THIS TIME.

DAILY LIFE AND RESPONSIBILITIES

A TOUR INVOLVES ADAPTING TO A NEW ENVIRONMENT, OFTEN UNDER CHALLENGING CONDITIONS. SERVICE MEMBERS MAY FACE COMBAT OPERATIONS, TRAINING EXERCISES, BASE SECURITY, OR HUMANITARIAN MISSIONS. DAILY SCHEDULES CAN BE RIGOROUS AND DEMANDING, WITH DUTIES VARYING WIDELY DEPENDING ON THE ROLE AND LOCATION.

CHALLENGES AND STRESSORS

LONG PERIODS AWAY FROM FAMILY AND HOME CAN BE EMOTIONALLY TAXING. THE UNCERTAINTY OF COMBAT SITUATIONS, HARSH LIVING CONDITIONS, AND LIMITED COMMUNICATION WITH LOVED ONES ADD LAYERS OF STRESS. MILITARY ORGANIZATIONS TYPICALLY PROVIDE SUPPORT SERVICES TO HELP PERSONNEL COPE WITH THESE CHALLENGES.

OPPORTUNITIES FOR GROWTH AND EXPERIENCE

DESPITE THE HARDSHIPS, A TOUR OF DUTY CAN PROVIDE INVALUABLE EXPERIENCES. MANY SERVICE MEMBERS DEVELOP LEADERSHIP SKILLS, RESILIENCE, AND CAMARADERIE THAT LAST A LIFETIME. EXPOSURE TO DIVERSE CULTURES AND ENVIRONMENTS ALSO BROADENS PERSPECTIVES.

How Military Organizations Manage Tour Lengths

To maintain operational readiness and personnel well-being, militaries carefully manage tour lengths through various strategies.

Rotation and Rest Periods

Most militaries enforce mandatory rest periods between tours to allow soldiers to recover physically and mentally. These breaks can vary but often last several months.

Flexible Deployment Policies

Some forces have introduced flexible deployment policies that allow adjustments based on individual circumstances or mission needs. This flexibility helps retain skilled personnel and reduces burnout.

Use of Reserve and National Guard Forces

In countries like the United States, reserve and National Guard units supplement active-duty forces, often rotating in and out of deployment zones. This system helps distribute the burden of deployments more evenly.

How Long Is a Tour of Duty in Different Countries?

Tour lengths can differ significantly around the world, reflecting each country's military doctrine and operational demands.

- **United States:** Combat tours typically last 9 to 12 months for the Army and Marines, 6 months for the Air Force, and 6 months or longer for the Navy.
- **United Kingdom:** British Army tours in Afghanistan were often 6 months, with some variations based on the unit and mission.
- **Australia:** Australian Defence Force personnel generally undertake 6-month tours, though this can vary.
- **Canada:** Canadian Armed Forces often deploy for 6 to 9 months depending on the operation.

These durations are subject to change based on evolving military needs and international commitments.

Tips for Service Members and Families Preparing for a Tour of Duty

Whether you're about to embark on your own tour or supporting a loved one, preparation is key to managing the challenges ahead.

- **STAY INFORMED:** UNDERSTAND THE EXPECTED LENGTH AND NATURE OF THE DEPLOYMENT TO SET REALISTIC EXPECTATIONS.
- **PLAN AHEAD:** ARRANGE FINANCES, FAMILY CARE, AND COMMUNICATION PLANS BEFORE DEPARTURE.
- **UTILIZE SUPPORT NETWORKS:** MILITARY ORGANIZATIONS OFFER COUNSELING, COMMUNITY GROUPS, AND RESOURCES—DON'T HESITATE TO TAP INTO THEM.
- **MAINTAIN COMMUNICATION:** REGULAR CONTACT, EVEN IF LIMITED, HELPS MAINTAIN EMOTIONAL BONDS AND MORALE.
- **FOCUS ON SELF-CARE:** BOTH SERVICE MEMBERS AND FAMILIES SHOULD PRIORITIZE MENTAL AND PHYSICAL HEALTH DURING THIS PERIOD.

UNDERSTANDING THE BIGGER PICTURE

ULTIMATELY, THE QUESTION OF HOW LONG IS A TOUR OF DUTY CANNOT BE ANSWERED WITH A SIMPLE NUMBER. IT'S A COMPLEX, MULTIFACETED CONCEPT SHAPED BY MILITARY STRATEGIES, INDIVIDUAL CIRCUMSTANCES, AND GLOBAL EVENTS. WHETHER SIX MONTHS OR A YEAR, A TOUR IS A SIGNIFICANT CHAPTER IN THE LIFE OF A SERVICE MEMBER—MARKED BY SACRIFICE, GROWTH, AND RESILIENCE.

BY GAINING INSIGHT INTO WHAT TOURS OF DUTY ENTAIL, THEIR TYPICAL DURATIONS, AND THE FACTORS THAT INFLUENCE THEM, CIVILIANS AND MILITARY FAMILIES ALIKE CAN BETTER APPRECIATE THE COMMITMENT INVOLVED IN SERVING ONE'S COUNTRY.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

WHAT IS THE TYPICAL LENGTH OF A TOUR OF DUTY IN THE MILITARY?

A TYPICAL TOUR OF DUTY IN THE MILITARY USUALLY LASTS BETWEEN 6 TO 12 MONTHS, DEPENDING ON THE BRANCH OF SERVICE AND DEPLOYMENT LOCATION.

HOW LONG IS A TOUR OF DUTY FOR SOLDIERS DEPLOYED OVERSEAS?

FOR SOLDIERS DEPLOYED OVERSEAS, A TOUR OF DUTY GENERALLY RANGES FROM 9 TO 12 MONTHS, BUT CAN VARY BASED ON THE MISSION AND COUNTRY OF DEPLOYMENT.

DO DIFFERENT BRANCHES OF THE MILITARY HAVE DIFFERENT TOUR OF DUTY LENGTHS?

YES, DIFFERENT BRANCHES OF THE MILITARY HAVE VARYING TOUR LENGTHS; FOR EXAMPLE, THE ARMY AND MARINES OFTEN HAVE 9-12 MONTH TOURS, WHILE THE NAVY AND AIR FORCE MAY HAVE SHORTER OR LONGER DEPLOYMENTS DEPENDING ON THEIR ROLES.

CAN A TOUR OF DUTY BE EXTENDED BEYOND ITS ORIGINAL LENGTH?

YES, TOURS OF DUTY CAN BE EXTENDED IN CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES, SUCH AS OPERATIONAL NEEDS OR EMERGENCIES, BUT EXTENSIONS TYPICALLY REQUIRE APPROVAL FROM MILITARY COMMAND.

ARE THERE ANY BREAKS BETWEEN CONSECUTIVE TOURS OF DUTY?

THERE ARE USUALLY REST AND RECUPERATION PERIODS BETWEEN CONSECUTIVE TOURS OF DUTY, INTENDED TO ALLOW SERVICE MEMBERS TIME TO RECOVER BEFORE THEIR NEXT DEPLOYMENT, THOUGH THE LENGTH OF THESE BREAKS VARIES.

DEFINING A TOUR OF DUTY: CONTEXT AND TERMINOLOGY

VARIATIONS ACROSS MILITARY BRANCHES

DIFFERENT BRANCHES WITHIN A COUNTRY’S ARMED FORCES OFTEN HAVE DISTINCT POLICIES REGARDING TOUR LENGTHS. FOR EXAMPLE, IN THE UNITED STATES MILITARY, THE ARMY, NAVY, AIR FORCE, AND MARINE CORPS EACH SET THEIR OWN STANDARDS BASED ON OPERATIONAL NEEDS.

- **U.S. ARMY:** TYPICALLY, ARMY TOURS OF DUTY IN COMBAT ZONES LIKE IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN HAVE RANGED FROM 9 TO 12 MONTHS. THIS DURATION ALLOWS FOR SUFFICIENT CONTINUITY IN MISSION OBJECTIVES WHILE MANAGING THE PSYCHOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL TOLL ON SOLDIERS.
- **U.S. MARINE CORPS:** MARINES OFTEN SERVE 6 TO 7 MONTHS IN COMBAT DEPLOYMENTS, REFLECTING THEIR EXPEDITIONARY ROLE AND THE INTENSE NATURE OF THEIR ASSIGNMENTS.
- **U.S. NAVY AND AIR FORCE:** TOURS MAY BE SHORTER OR LONGER DEPENDING ON WHETHER PERSONNEL ARE SHIP-BASED, STATIONED ON AIRCRAFT CARRIERS, OR ASSIGNED TO AIRBASES. NAVY DEPLOYMENTS, FOR INSTANCE, TYPICALLY LAST ABOUT 6 MONTHS, THOUGH THIS CAN EXTEND DURING CRITICAL MISSIONS.

THESE VARIATIONS UNDERScore THE TAILORED APPROACH MILITARIES TAKE TO OPTIMIZE OPERATIONAL READINESS AND PERSONNEL MANAGEMENT.

INTERNATIONAL PERSPECTIVES ON TOUR LENGTHS

WHEN EXAMINING HOW LONG IS A TOUR OF DUTY GLOBALLY, IT BECOMES CLEAR THAT DIFFERENT COUNTRIES ADAPT THEIR DEPLOYMENT POLICIES BASED ON THEIR MILITARY DOCTRINES, LOGISTICAL CAPABILITIES, AND POLITICAL FRAMEWORKS.

UNITED KINGDOM

THE BRITISH ARMED FORCES GENERALLY SET TOURS OF DUTY LASTING 6 MONTHS FOR COMBAT DEPLOYMENTS, SUCH AS THOSE IN AFGHANISTAN UNDER OPERATION HERRICK. HOWEVER, PEACEKEEPING MISSIONS UNDER THE UNITED NATIONS OR NATO COMMAND MAY INVOLVE TOURS RANGING FROM 4 TO 12 MONTHS, DEPENDING ON THE STABILITY OF THE REGION AND THE MISSION'S DEMANDS.

AUSTRALIA AND CANADA

AUSTRALIAN DEFENCE FORCE DEPLOYMENTS OFTEN LAST AROUND 6 MONTHS, PARTICULARLY IN COMBAT ZONES LIKE AFGHANISTAN. SIMILARLY, CANADIAN FORCES TYPICALLY DEPLOY FOR 6 TO 9 MONTHS IN OPERATIONAL THEATERS, WITH SOME FLEXIBILITY BASED ON THE NATURE OF THE MISSION AND ROTATION SCHEDULES.

OTHER COUNTRIES

NATIONS WITH SMALLER MILITARY FORCES OR THOSE ENGAGED PRIMARILY IN PEACEKEEPING MAY HAVE SHORTER TOURS TO ALLOW FOR GREATER ROTATION. CONVERSELY, COUNTRIES WITH LIMITED MANPOWER MIGHT HAVE LONGER TOURS TO MAINTAIN SUFFICIENT TROOP PRESENCE, THOUGH THIS CAN INCREASE THE RISK OF FATIGUE AND STRESS AMONG PERSONNEL.

FACTORS AFFECTING THE DURATION OF A TOUR OF DUTY

SEVERAL CRITICAL FACTORS INFLUENCE HOW LONG A TOUR OF DUTY LASTS, EXTENDING BEYOND MERE MILITARY STRATEGY.

OPERATIONAL REQUIREMENTS

THE NATURE OF THE MISSION PLAYS A FUNDAMENTAL ROLE. HIGH-INTENSITY COMBAT OPERATIONS TYPICALLY NECESSITATE SHORTER TOURS TO REDUCE COMBAT STRESS AND PREVENT BURNOUT. IN CONTRAST, LONG-TERM PEACEKEEPING OR ADVISORY ROLES MIGHT INVOLVE EXTENDED TOURS TO MAINTAIN CONTINUITY AND BUILD RELATIONSHIPS WITH LOCAL POPULATIONS.

PERSONNEL WELLBEING AND MENTAL HEALTH

MODERN MILITARIES INCREASINGLY RECOGNIZE THE IMPORTANCE OF MANAGING THE PSYCHOLOGICAL HEALTH OF THEIR PERSONNEL. EXTENDED DEPLOYMENTS ARE LINKED TO HIGHER RATES OF POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER (PTSD), DEPRESSION, AND ANXIETY. AS SUCH, TOUR LENGTHS ARE OFTEN CAPPED TO MITIGATE THESE RISKS, WITH MANDATORY REST AND RECUPERATION PERIODS INCORPORATED BETWEEN DEPLOYMENTS.

POLITICAL AND PUBLIC OPINION

GOVERNMENT POLICIES AND PUBLIC SENTIMENT CAN ALSO IMPACT TOUR DURATIONS. IN DEMOCRATIC SOCIETIES, PUBLIC OPPOSITION TO PROLONGED MILITARY ENGAGEMENTS CAN PRESSURE GOVERNMENTS TO SHORTEN TOURS OR ACCELERATE TROOP ROTATIONS. THIS DYNAMIC WAS EVIDENT DURING THE IRAQ AND AFGHANISTAN CONFLICTS, WHERE TOUR LENGTHS WERE PERIODICALLY ADJUSTED IN RESPONSE TO POLITICAL CONSIDERATIONS.

LOGISTICAL AND RESOURCE CONSTRAINTS

THE ABILITY TO SUSTAIN TROOPS IN A GIVEN LOCATION DEPENDS ON LOGISTICAL SUPPORT, INCLUDING TRANSPORTATION, SUPPLIES, AND MEDICAL CARE. EXTENDED TOURS MAY STRAIN THESE RESOURCES, PROMPTING MILITARIES TO LIMIT DEPLOYMENT LENGTHS.

PROS AND CONS OF DIFFERENT TOUR LENGTHS

UNDERSTANDING THE ADVANTAGES AND DISADVANTAGES OF VARIOUS TOUR DURATIONS CAN ILLUMINATE WHY MILITARIES CHOOSE SPECIFIC TIMEFRAMES.

SHORT TOURS (3-6 MONTHS)

- **PROS:** REDUCED RISK OF PSYCHOLOGICAL AND PHYSICAL FATIGUE; EASIER TO MAINTAIN TROOP MORALE; QUICKER ROTATION KEEPS FORCES FRESH.
- **CONS:** INCREASED FREQUENCY OF ROTATIONS CAN DISRUPT UNIT COHESION; HIGHER OPERATIONAL COSTS DUE TO MORE FREQUENT DEPLOYMENT CYCLES.

MEDIUM TOURS (6-12 MONTHS)

- **PROS:** ALLOWS FOR DEEPER ENGAGEMENT IN MISSION OBJECTIVES; BETTER UNIT COHESION AND CONTINUITY; BALANCED APPROACH TO OPERATIONAL DEMANDS AND PERSONNEL WELLBEING.
- **CONS:** INCREASED RISK OF STRESS AND BURNOUT; LONGER TIME AWAY FROM FAMILY AND HOME SUPPORT NETWORKS.

EXTENDED TOURS (OVER 12 MONTHS)

- **PROS:** GREATER STABILITY AND LONG-TERM PRESENCE IN OPERATIONAL AREAS; FEWER DEPLOYMENT TRANSITIONS NEEDED.
- **CONS:** HIGH RISK OF PSYCHOLOGICAL STRAIN; CHALLENGES WITH RETENTION AND MORALE; POTENTIAL NEGATIVE IMPACT ON FAMILY LIFE AND REINTEGRATION.

THE CHANGING NATURE OF TOUR LENGTHS IN MODERN WARFARE

ADVANCEMENTS IN MILITARY TECHNOLOGY, SHIFTS IN GEOPOLITICAL LANDSCAPES, AND EVOLVING DOCTRINES HAVE ALL INFLUENCED HOW LONG IS A TOUR OF DUTY TODAY. DRONES, REMOTE OPERATIONS, AND CYBER WARFARE ARE INCREASINGLY SUPPLEMENTING TRADITIONAL DEPLOYMENTS, POTENTIALLY REDUCING THE NEED FOR PROLONGED PHYSICAL PRESENCE IN HOSTILE ENVIRONMENTS.

MOREOVER, RESERVE FORCES AND ROTATIONAL UNITS ALLOW FOR MORE FLEXIBLE DEPLOYMENT MODELS, ENABLING MILITARIES TO ADAPT TOUR LENGTHS DYNAMICALLY BASED ON REAL-TIME ASSESSMENTS OF RISK AND MISSION PROGRESS. THIS FLEXIBILITY CONTRASTS WITH HISTORICAL CONFLICTS WHERE TOUR LENGTHS WERE OFTEN FIXED AND LESS RESPONSIVE TO CHANGING CIRCUMSTANCES.

IMPACT OF COVID-19 ON TOUR DURATIONS

THE GLOBAL PANDEMIC INTRODUCED UNPRECEDENTED CHALLENGES TO MILITARY DEPLOYMENTS, LEADING TO ADJUSTMENTS IN TOUR LENGTHS. TRAVEL RESTRICTIONS, QUARANTINE REQUIREMENTS, AND HEALTH CONCERNS CAUSED SOME TOURS TO BE EXTENDED OR SHORTENED UNEXPECTEDLY. THESE DISRUPTIONS HIGHLIGHTED THE IMPORTANCE OF AGILITY IN MANAGING TOUR DURATIONS AMID GLOBAL CRISES.

CONCLUSION: THE COMPLEXITY BEHIND A SIMPLE QUESTION

THE INQUIRY INTO HOW LONG IS A TOUR OF DUTY DOES NOT YIELD A ONE-SIZE-FITS-ALL ANSWER. INSTEAD, IT REVEALS A MULTIFACETED INTERPLAY OF OPERATIONAL NEEDS, HUMAN FACTORS, POLITICAL PRESSURES, AND LOGISTICAL REALITIES. WHILE THE TYPICAL RANGE FOR MANY MILITARY FORCES FALLS BETWEEN 6 TO 12 MONTHS, EXCEPTIONS ABOUND BASED ON THE UNIQUE CIRCUMSTANCES OF EACH DEPLOYMENT.

BY UNDERSTANDING THE NUANCES BEHIND TOUR LENGTHS, STAKEHOLDERS—FROM SERVICE MEMBERS AND THEIR FAMILIES TO POLICYMAKERS AND THE PUBLIC—CAN BETTER APPRECIATE THE CHALLENGES INVOLVED IN BALANCING MISSION SUCCESS WITH THE WELLBEING OF THOSE WHO SERVE.

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
